

Pond dipping for educational visits Denese Swann, Maggie Bellwood January 2025 As required



SCOPE

This assessment is intended to mitigate risk to children, their staff and RNR volunteers attending pond dipping sessions during educational visits to Rodley Nature Reserve.

METHOD STATEMENT

Children and their supervising adults are accompanied to the ponds by RNR volunteers during educational visits.

Short handled nets, trays and ID sheets are issued from a locked box to groups and members are given a briefing as to safety and best dipping practice by RNR vols. A safety precautions

leaflet is also issued, and the group is asked to comply with its recommendations. No items are issued to unsupervised children.

A throw line and first aid kit is available. However schools and groups are expected to have their own kits including epi-pens and specific items for known issues within each cohort.

RNR volunteers will inspect ponds and their environments prior to each visit to ensure they are clear of trip hazards and that deck surfaces are not slippery.

	Water borne micro- organisms	Dipping Team must ensure any existing cuts or abrasions are covered and waterproofed prior to dipping (School/group leader to carry out if needed)	RNR

		Under no circumstances must pond water be used for hand cleaning purposes	RNR
		Dipping Team to ensure any cuts or abrasions received are washed and covered immediately (School Leader to carry out if needed)	RNR
		First Aid Kit to be available at the Visitor Centre and groups to have their own with them	RNR/school/group
	Weather: Lightning Strike	In the event of a thunder storm, session to cease immediately and site occupants vacated to a safe area	RNR
	Sunstroke/Burning	In the event of sun, effective head protection and sun block cream must be used	School/group staff
	Dehydration	In the event of extreme sun/temperature conditions, sessions must be of an appropriate duration to prevent sunstroke/burning/dehydration	RNR
